


underlying orders in this proceeding to remove the petitioner’s name from the orders. Respondent asserted that based on the testimony given by the witnesses in the hearing, she believed that petitioner had been incorrectly named in the orders as she was only an owner in name and had no influence over the business. Petitioner did not oppose the motion.

After review of the pleadings and the hearing record, and after full consideration of the Board’s Rules of Procedure and Practice, the Board grants the motion and the orders are amended to remove petitioner Pascuala Campos’s name.


The underlying orders name another individual and a corporation; neither petitioned the Board to review the orders pursuant to Labor Law § 101 (1). The underlying orders as issued against the individual (Jose Rafael Santamaria Cortez a/k/a Jose Santamaria) and the corporation (Tropicana Corp. T/A Tropicana Restaurant) remain valid unless declared invalid in a proceeding before the Board under Labor Law § 103 (1). Based on the above, the Board is granting the petition and revoking the order only as to the named individual Pascuala Campos.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

1. Effective as of the date of this Resolution of Decision, the Board grants respondent’s motion to amend the Order Under Article 19 of the Labor Law issued September 12, 2017 and the Order Under Articles 5 and 19 of the Labor Law issued September 12, 2017 to remove Pascuala Campos’s name, and
2. The petition of Pascuala Campos is granted.

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
